Help your child identify the things on the woman's table: yeast, flour, water, dough being kneaded, dough rising, risen dough.

Then help your child to point to each object in turn and tell the story of how the small piece of yeast made the flour grow into lots of dough, ready to be baked into bread.

Why not make some bread together this week? Try using a pack of bread mix, explaining that the yeast and flour are already mixed together. Match your dough to the pictures on this sheet as it rises!


